From the Principal

Dear Parents / Caregivers,

On our Pupil Free Day last Monday, the focus of our professional learning was on Digital Technologies. The Digital Technologies in the Australian Curriculum provides students with opportunities to consider how solutions that are created now will be used in the future.

As you can see from the diagram there is greater emphasis on communicating, investigating

and creating with ICT in a context social and ethical practices. Linking with mathematics and systems thinking, computational thinking helps students break down a problem into parts so it can be easier to solve as well as understanding how systems work. We also explored basic coding

using desk top robots called blue-bots. The challenge from here is how to integrate and implement this new thinking across the curriculum.

Intervention

Also on the Pupil Free Day, we had input and discussion from Carly Nash on Learning Intervention. This session enabled us to clarify our processes in relation to how learning intervention occurs in our school. We use a three tier process:

- Tier 1 – All students participate in year level instruction (ie the core work)
- Tier 2 – Students receive extra assistance with the core work (ie core + more)
- Tier 3 – This is where students with the greatest need receive intensive assistance (ie core + more + more)

An example of a Tier 3 intervention that we have introduced this term is QuickSmart. QuickSmart is a numeracy intervention program for Years 4-7 students who have been identified as needing extra support with numeracy. The program is part of the DECD Results Plus initiative.
